A. Improve patient, staff and public safety

- We have increased safety and security training completion at FPH. PVPC curriculum, PVPC refresher and ATR completion-rate increases are listed below.

B. Improve clinical service delivery and patient-centred care

- A recent FPH Visioning and Model of Care Refresh Day saw 70 staff and physicians participate to create an inspired future for FPH, including developing ideas for future unit structure, patient mix and patient flow.
- A new risk behaviour tracking tool will be piloted on a FPH unit in January.

C. Strengthen leadership, inter-disciplinary teamwork and professional development

- UK Clinical Security Liaison Nurse and Site Manager Antony Wragg visited FPH. He provided training and consultation to staff and practical support for the continued integration of therapeutic and relational security into all aspects of patient care.
- The Guarding Minds survey was completed by 222 staff at FPH and will be used to inform a strategy to improve the psychological health and resiliency of staff. The survey is a partnership between FPH leadership, BC Nurses' Union, BC Government and Service Employees' Union, Health Sciences Association of BC, and PHSA's Psychological Health & Wellness Team.
